

Skilled Nursing and Rehab reopening at Klein Center 2024





Klein Center's skilled rehab area on the second floor, known as Madison Avenue, was unable to accept patients beginning Summer 2022. The decision to close Madison Avenue and only care for long-term residents was due to unforeseen circumstances related to COVID-19 and nursing shortages. In January 2024, Great River Health announced the re-opening of Madison Avenue.









Klein Center is a 5-star facility on Compare Care and is one of only seven 5-star facilities in a 50-mile radius according to Medicare.gov. Klein Center sits across the lake from Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center, and offers scenic views of the lake and gardens that surround the building. Inside Klein, Madison Avenue is where patients receive rehabilitation care after their hospital stays.

Skilled care often begins when a patient has stayed more than three overnights in the hospital and would benefit from extended services. Depending on a patient's insurance, some may require a pre-authorization to qualify for skilled care. A high percentage of skilled care admissions result from medical or surgical procedures such as hip fractures, joint replacements, or a medical event such as a heart attack, stroke, Gl bleed, or pneumonia.

Our physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, and nurses work with patients to create comprehensive care plans to help restore or improve patient's physical, cognitive, or functional abilities. With skilled care, the primary objective is always to help patients fully recover or to assist them in regaining the highest level of function and independence.

The Klein Center is unique in being one of the only care facilities in the area that offers all private rooms and bathrooms to residents. Klein Center also offers living and dining areas specifically designated for skilled patients.

Other amenities include:

- Beauty shop Business office
- Chapel Coffee shop
- Gathering Hall Library
- Restorative gym (A rehabilitation gym with physical therapy and occupational therapy.)

Three-time resident Barb Carmen shared what kept her choosing Klein Center for her extended care, "The care is terrific; I can tell they care about me, and they like their jobs. The Klein Center is also close to my family so that they can visit me anytime."

The reopening of skilled services at Klein has been a much needed and welcomed addition to the services we offer. Vice President of Post Acute Care, Beth Fleming, said, "Klein's skilled census has been full since its reopening, and we are thrilled to announce that we plan to double the capacity in the coming months. We are very proud of our 92% return to home rate. Our therapists and nursing staff work hard to meet the needs of our residents along with setting aggressive goals to achieve their desired outcome. Klein is proud to be a part of the health system, following our motto, Right **Place**, Right **Care**, Right **Here**."

Rural Health Clinics provide care close to home

When it comes to caring for your family's medical needs, access to quality healthcare is vital. Great River Health meets this need by providing primary care on all three hospital campuses located in West Burlington, Fort Madison, and Mount Pleasant. However, primary care is also available to those individuals in rural communities throughout Southeast lowa.

Henry County Health Center Clinics are committed to providing convenient, local access to healthcare for the region's rural areas. Our full-service clinics offer same-day appointments for illness and injury, with a full range of health services available for all ages, including laboratory testing, well-child exams and immunizations, men's and women's health, chronic disease management, wellness and prevention, specialty procedures, and more.

For patients requiring additional hospital services, our clinic providers work closely with Henry County Health Center and Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center departments to provide seamless care. The wide range of services at these hospitals enables patients to receive care close to home. Our shared medical record system allows providers at any clinic to access patient's health information.

The clinics are accepting new patients of all ages, and accept most insurance plans, including Medicare.

Breast Health personalized care

One in eight women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime. This statistic remains one of the driving reasons behind the push for annual mammograms for all women starting at the age of 40. Early detection allows for better treatment options, and it is proven women who have an annual mammogram are less likely to die from the disease.

Great River Health is investing in updated mammography machines to ensure all women have access to breast cancer screening. Seven new 3D mammogram machines, known as tomosynthesis, are being installed across the health system with the first two in place at SEIRMC — Fort Madison and HCHC. These new FUJIFILM machines bring the latest innovation, comfort, and clarity to our Diagnostic Imaging Departments.

"We looked at four different vendors before choosing FUJIFILM mammogram machines. We took a team of mammography technologists to evaluate different machines at other facilities. We then had our radiologists review the images for quality and clarity. At the end of this vetting process, we chose FUJIFILM. The key factor, though is providing our patients with the best technology to drive better outcomes through early detection," explained Greg Fields, Great River Health Vice President of Diagnostic Imaging.

Creating a personalized care pathway will now be a standard part of breast health at Great River Health. With the integration of new software, a personalized pathway for each patient will be available based on known risk factors, breast density, and family history. As part of the standard intake process, patients complete a questionnaire with a series of questions regarding personal and family history. With the patient's consent, a free risk modeling and risk assessment is created unique to them. This information along with breast density is used in risk model calculations to provide a comprehensive picture of the patient's cancer risk. This scorecard will be used by your radiologist and healthcare provider to determine your care plan which may include further testing.

Improved patient experience is a key component to encouraging annual testing. The new mammogram machines offer faster overall compression and more comfortable paddles. Other fun additions include gown warmers, new robes, and hand warmers for the technologists. Each diagnostic team will also choose the wrap on the machine, giving it more personal touch.

Urgent Care renamed

To enhance clarity and accessibility, the Urgent Care clinics in West Burlington and Fort Madison are being renamed to Walk-In Clinic. There will be no change to the providers or healthcare services offered at either location.

This change, while primarily cosmetic, highlights Great River Health's commitment to providing quality, convenient, and affordable medical care to residents in Southeast Iowa.

Our Walk-In Clinics serve as a vital resource for those seeking prompt medical attention for non-life-threatening conditions. From sudden illnesses like severe colds and the flu to injuries such as sprains and strains, they offer diagnosis and treatment when you can't wait for an appointment or when other clinics are closed.

With a full range of care, including on-site laboratory and X-ray services, you can expect the same level of expertise and attention to your healthcare needs.

The Great River Health Walk-In Clinics are suitable for everyone six months and older, especially those who either lack a primary care provider or need extended clinic hours.

As the name suggests, appointments are walk-in only, allowing you to simply show up and receive the healthcare you need, with the option of a follow-up with your primary care provider. With this clinic name change, Great River Health continues to foster a more transparent and accessible approach to medical care delivery, ensuring that the community's health remains a top priority and that residents have the right care at the right place at the right time.



Recruitment and Retention key drivers of success

Recruiting and retaining good employees

takes a well-thought-out plan, utilizing a full battery of tools. Great River Health has implemented new initiatives over the past few years to build a pipeline for recruiting new employees while also appreciating the importance of retaining current staff.

Realizing the nursing shortage was not going away any time soon, Great River Health partnered with Southeastern Community College (SCC) in Spring of 2022 to encourage more students to enter the nursing program. With the support of the Great River Health Foundation, over \$930,000 has been distributed to provide financial assistance to students in the nursing program.

Building on the success of this initiative, Great River Health and SCC enhanced their partnership to create a radiologic technology program. The 24-month program is scheduled to start in the fall of 2024. In addition to housing the program classroom, simulation lab facilities and staff offices, Great River Health will underwrite the cost of two faculty positions and offer a limited number of student sponsorships.

Great River Health was recognized at the Greater Burlington Partnership Annual Dinner as the 2023 Champion of Hidden Talent for launching the Right Choice, Internal Resource Pool. The Right Choice, Internal Resource Pool provides a more flexible working option for nurses. As employees of Great River Health, they can self-schedule the shift and location they want to work based on available staffing needs. These nurses receive a higher rate of pay but are not eligible to receive benefits. Right Choice, Internal Resource Pool, is the right choice for nurses wanting stability, flexibility, and variety.

The retention of current staff has been a focus of Michael Yost, Executive Vice President of Human Resources. He started with Great River Health in February of 2023 and has been busy realigning the Human Resources Department to better support the needs of the organization. Along with being involved in the creation of the Right Choice program, other work highlights include:

- **Total Rewards Program** puts all employee benefits information in one convenient place for both employees and prospective employees. Covering both an employee's personal and professional needs, Total Rewards provides beneficial resources.
- Culture Advisory Council is an employee driven committee consisting of employees from various business units, levels, and locations throughout the health system. The members were chosen through an application process and serve as cultural ambassadors, actively contributing to and promoting the desired culture within Great River Health.
- **Employee Engagement Survey** seeks valuable feedback from our employees to improve the current work experience and drive new opportunities for enhancement. This annual survey and subsequent action plans will continue to build upon the success of the organization in retaining high quality employees.

Jones grew up in Southeast Iowa and graduated from the University of Iowa College of Pharmacy. She has worked in retail pharmacy since 2006, now serving as pharmacist at Heritage Pharmacy-Mount Pleasant, located on the Henry County Health Center campus.

"I love the fact that as Lead Pharmacist at Heritage Pharmacy-Mount Pleasant, I can really get to know each of our patients individually.
