Great River Friends Offers Scholarships for 2021-2022 Year

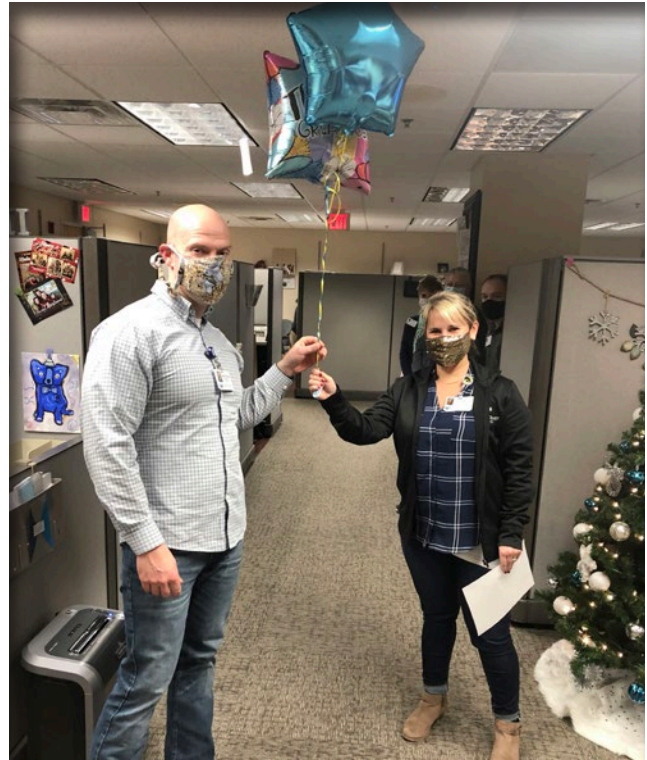
Applications for Great River Friends scholarships for the 2020-2021 school year are available. Two types of scholarships are offered to students pursuing health care careers.

Applicants for high school scholarships must be seniors with minimum 3.0 grade point averages. They must live in or attend schools within Great River Health's service area (about 60 miles).

Applicants for continuing college student scholarships must have graduated from high schools in Great River Health's service area in the last 10 years and have completed at least one year of college. Students in graduate school may apply.

Scholarship applications must be postmarked or delivered by Saturday, Feb. 15.

March 30 Deadline for State Health Care Scholarships

The Iowa Hospital Education and Research Foundation (IHERF) is offering 60 scholarships for the coming school year. The goal of the Health Care Careers Scholarship program is to fill Iowa health care positions that have a notable number of openings by offering significant financial support to students seeking health care education or training.

In exchange, each \$3,500 award recipient must commit to working one year in an Iowa hospital for each year of the scholarship award. Recipients of \$1,000 awards must commit to working one year with a hospital-based or hospital-contracted emergency medical service.

IHERF will identify placement opportunities in each Iowa Hospital Association geographic district (a district map is included with the application).

Scholarship applicants must be enrolled in an accredited program and be within two-years of completing their professional education. The application deadline is Tuesday, March 30. [Get more information.](#)

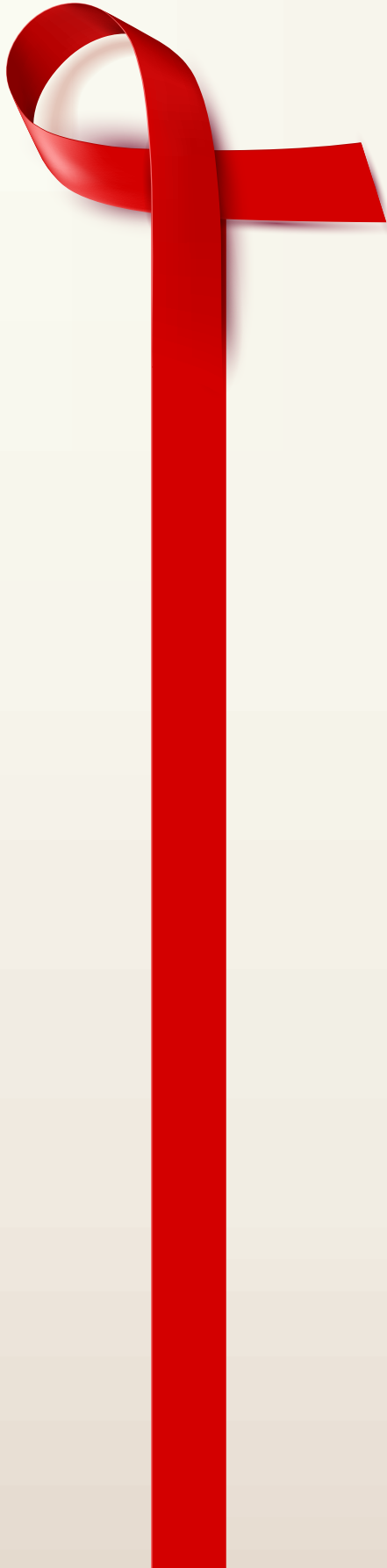

Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program

The mission of the Iowa Ryan White Part B Program is to fund primary health care and support services for low-income patients living with HIV to control the disease and improve their quality of life. Program help is available at Great River Medical Center.

Through the Ryan White Program, the Iowa Department of Public Health provides funding to local agencies. This includes providing direct access to lifesaving medications through the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP). ADAP provides free medications for the treatment of HIV/AIDS and opportunistic infections, which are infections that occur more frequently and are more severe in people with weakened immune systems. These drugs treat symptoms and can help people live longer.

ADAP can help people who are not fully covered by other payers under certain circumstances. Case managers help clients:

- Make and keep appointments
- Follow their medication schedule
- Manage other aspects of their lives

Besides increasing access to care underserved populations and improving quality of life, the intention of the program is to reduce the use of more-costly inpatient and urgent care, and decrease transmission of HIV.
