Now in its ninth year, the INDEX leverages 50 rural-relevant indicators across eight pillars of hospital strength (i.e. Inpatient Market Share, Outpatient Market Share, Cost, Charge, Quality, Outcomes, Patient Perspective and Financial Stability) to determine an overall score for each hospital. Each of the INDEX's 50 indicators is pulled from publicly-available data sources.

HCHC Oncology/Hematology Clinic provides care close to home

Henry County Health Center is partnering with Great River Health System to provide oncology treatment locally. Mohammed Alhyari, MD, and Luz Cortes, MD, Great River Health System cancer and blood disorder specialists, see patients weekly at HCHC's Oncology/Hematology Clinic in Mt. Pleasant.

The partnership allows area residents to receive cancer care close to home. In addition to the weekly clinic, HCHC's Infusion/Chemotherapy Department provides care for patients through all stages of cancer treatment including chemotherapy services Monday through Friday. At HCHC, patients also receive outpatient services for cancer care including lab testing and services in imaging, surgery, inpatient department and much more.

Receiving benefits from healthcare services close to home

Judy and Jim Strasser of Morning Sun discovered the importance of having local access to high quality healthcare services. Following her heart attack and two heart procedures in Iowa City, Judy was referred for follow-up care at HCHC.

In Mt. Pleasant she was able to see a visiting cardiologist in HCHC's Specialty Clinic, and also enrolled in the health center's Cardiac Rehabilitation program. The multi-level individualized program is designed to help cardiac patients reach their highest level of health, staffed by registered nurses



who have extensive experience in the field of cardiac rehab.

The Strassers were very pleased with the care that Judy received at HCHC.

"I had 36 sessions of cardiac rehab for 12 weeks. The nurses were wonderful. I liked that I could do all of my follow-up at HCHC versus driving back and forth to lowa City," explained Judy.
